**1. Call to Order**

The meeting of the Parks and Recreation Advisory Board is called to order at 5:39 p.m. by Commissioner Gallagher.

**2. Consider approval of Minutes: April 4, 2019**

Commissioner Wiederhold makes a motion to approve the minutes. Commissioner Joubert seconds and the motion passes with a unanimous vote.

**3. Discuss proposal to beautify Tyler Blacklock area at Maroney Park.**

Commissioner Gallagher leads discussion. He says this area is not a welcoming sight right at the entrance of this playground and is not a proper memorial for Tyler. He suggests bringing in new sand and installing a new excavator toy. Mr. Bray agrees and says Parks staff will work on cleaning up the area. Everyone agrees that the area should be beautified.

**4. Discuss restroom locations and design for Maroney Park.**

Mr. Bray explains \$35-40,000 in funding has been secured to build a small restroom to be located next to the new Splash Pad. This is in addition to a city-funded restroom to be located closer to the playground. The splash pad restroom will be design to mirror the Leadership Nac pavilions which are being developed for the site. Staff has discussed building the restroom in between the existing pavilion and the new splash pad.

Commissioner Rizzo asks what the timeline is for this restroom. Mr. Bray says the project was pushed back due to a drainage issue.

**5. Receive report on Recreation activities.**

Mrs. Schmidt gives the Recreation report. Department revenue is \$169,913 as of June 13<sup>th</sup>, 2019. She goes over the new summer programs, including Finance 101. Commissioner Wiederhold says people really need to learn how to save, so this is a good program to offer. She says staff is discussing new ideas for Corporate Challenge for next year and Commissioner Wiederhold suggest axe throwing.

**6. Receive report on Parks activities.**

Mrs. Andersen gives the Parks report. She goes over the Event Impact Summary for a recent disc golf tournament. She updates the board on recent comments from the public on the City's social media, as

people are requesting more ADA accessible playgrounds. She says staff is already looking into incorporating individual accessible pieces at existing playgrounds and says this is something the board has discussed at several previous meetings.

**7. Adjourn.**

The meeting is adjourned at 6:27 p.m. by Commissioner Gallagher.

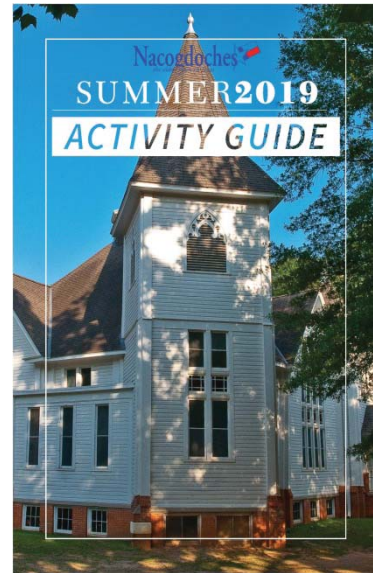

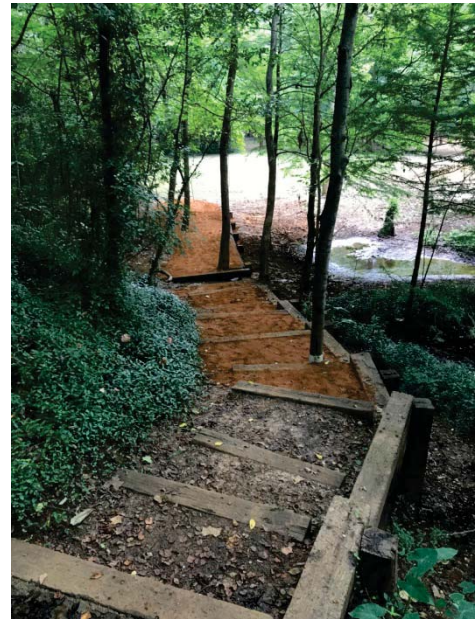
